- 7:30-8pm Discussion of Regional Assembly
 - What is it? Why do we have one? Who's invited?
 - Discussion of Theme for Regional Assembly "Go.Grow.Inpsire"
 - GO: THIS BARN QUILT REMINDS US THAT WE ARE CALLED TO CARRY THE GOOD NEWS TO ENDS OF THE EARTH.
 - "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."
 - Go: move from one place to another. A person's turn to use or do something. Attempt to try at something. Leave or depart.

- GROW THIS BARN QUILT REMINDS US TO REMAIN ROOTED IN CHRIST JESUS.
 - "Let your roots grow down into him, and let your lives be built on him. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth you were taught, and you will overflow with thankfulness." COLOSSIANS 2:7
 - Grow: undergo a natural process of change. To cultivate or develop.
 Cause something to expand or increase. Germinate and develop.
- INSPIRE- THIS BARN QUILT REMINDS US THAT NOT ONLY DOES
 SCRIPTURE INSPIRE, BUT OUR LIVES CAN INSPIRE OTHERS BY THE WAY WE CHOOSE TO LIVE.
 - "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right." 2 TIMOTHY 3:16
 - Inspire: Feel the urge to do something, especially something creative.
 Breathe in air, or inhale. Create a positive feeling in heart of another.

8-8:45 Collaborative Art Project

- Ouring this window of time, we will create three barn quilts that remind us of our themes for the Assembly with magazine clippings. Barn quilts are a distinct symbol frequently found on barns in the Appalachian region of the US and more specifically, Eastern Kentucky, where the Regional Assembly is being held this year. During this session we will learn about this distinct Appalachian art practice and create a barn quilt of sorts together.
- History of Barn Quilts: Did you know that barn quilts were initially used as markers when traveling on the countryside? They would help travelers know which way to go on their journey. Over the years they also symbolized abundance, strength, and other characteristics of a farming family.

GO SESSION

During this session we will discuss the great commission and how we are called to share our faith. SATURDAY, 7:30AM-NOON

INSPIRE SESSION

During this session we will talk about the things that inspire us and give us hope, while also talking about the inspiration of the scripture by the power of the Holy Spirit. We will discuss how Jesus inspires us to live differently and radically in our world. We will also have conversations about people we look up to, such and mentors, parents, pastors, and Christians whose faith we honor.
